About the role

The **General Manager – Sydney** will report to the Chief Operating Officer and will be a key member of the senior leadership team that oversees regulatory activities across Australia. The position will offer high level strategic support, advice and assistance to the Chief Operating Officer and will be delegated with the authority to deliver outcomes on both a state and national level.

You will be responsible for delivering the regulatory and administrative rail safety activities of the Sydney office in accordance with the policies and processes of the ONRSR. This position performs a key role in establishing effective regulatory relationships with senior safety managers of railway organisations and other external stakeholders.

The General Manager - Sydney will work collaboratively with other General Managers around the country, as well as other internal workgroups throughout ONRSR to ensure alignment with wider corporate goals and strategic objectives.



Your compliance

As a regulator, it is important that we are all on the same page when it comes to safety and risk management and everyone at ONRSR is responsible to actively supporting this aspect of our role to promote a positive and safe culture. ONRSR has a zero tolerance to the use of alcohol and non-prescription drugs for all workers while undertaking ONRSR work. This includes workers recalled to duty



unexpectedly who should decline to work if doing so puts them in breach of the Drug and Alcohol Policy.

Other items of note

On occasions, this role will require you to work outside of normal business hours, on weekends and public holidays.
