	<p>About ONRSR</p> <p>The Office of the National Rail Safety Regulator (ONRSR) plays an integral role in keeping Australians safe across the nation's vast and varied rail networks. 	<p>Your Responsibilities</p> <p>Activities</p> <p>Combining your enthusiasm for achieving quality outcomes and your demonstrated experience in law, you will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide timely, high quality legal advice and support to key decision makers across ONRSR. • Represent ONRSR in court and tribunals at all levels and instructing counsel where necessary. • Deliver tactical legal advice to the Investigations team and other Operational staff as required. • Review briefs of evidence and prepare sufficiency of evidence assessments, making informed regulatory recommendations. • Prepare and deliver training to the Investigations team on legal powers, evidentiary issues and emerging legal considerations. • Contribute to legal insights and advice on strategic enforcement initiatives. • Responsible for maintaining a legal database of advice, decisions and outcomes to support organisational knowledge and consistency. • Provide strategic legal advice in the development of strategies and policies for successful management of legal risk within the parameters of the ONRSR's regulatory and legal services program. • Assist with the management of the provision of legal services from external providers to ensure effective and efficient service delivery. • Represent ONRSR in interjurisdictional and national forums, committees and working groups. • Provide specialist advice on complex regulatory and legal policy issues pertinent to the rail network.
	<p>What you Bring – Key Competencies</p> <p>Key to success in this role is that you have:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Demonstrated experience and expertise in statutory interpretation, legal drafting, together with demonstrated knowledge and experience in undertaking prosecutions. • A minimum of 5 years and expertise in statutory interpretation, legal drafting, with a strong track record of managing and conducting complex prosecutions, particularly in a regulatory or safety related context. • Exceptional interpersonal, communication and negotiation skills, with the ability to build strong relationships and influence stakeholders at all levels. • Proven ability to operate effectively in fast paced, evolving environments, showing resilience and confidence in managing challenges. • Proven high level strategic thinking skills and demonstrated ability to analyse and conceptualise problems, formulate and execute appropriate solutions and negotiate successful outcomes. • Demonstrated ability to work effectively in a team environment, managing competing priorities and contributing to shared goals.

	<p>Helpful qualifications and experience</p> <p>To perform effectively in this role you will possess legal qualifications, including an appropriate practicing certificate.</p> <p>You will have over 5 years of prosecution experience.</p> <p>Demonstrated experience in prosecuting safety duty offences or similar is highly desirable.</p> <p>Your compliance</p> <p>As a regulator, it is important that we are all on the same page when it comes to safety and risk management and everyone at ONRSR is responsible to actively supporting this aspect of our role to promote a positive and safe culture. ONRSR has a zero tolerance to the use of alcohol and non-prescription drugs for all workers while undertaking ONRSR work. This includes workers recalled to duty unexpectedly who should decline to work if doing so puts them in breach of the Drug and Alcohol Policy.</p> <p>Other items of note</p> <p>On occasions, this role will require you to work outside of normal business hours, on weekends and public holidays. There is a requirement to travel which may include short stays in ONRSR interstate offices. This includes actively participating in the Performance Development and Review process; demonstrating appropriate and professional behaviours in accordance with the Code of Conduct and values; providing assistance to team members if required; and undertaking other key responsibilities or activities as directed.</p>
