About the Role

We are looking for an experienced investigator to be based at ONRSR's national office in Adelaide who can plan, participate, and lead investigations into alleged or suspected non-compliance and breaches of the Rail Safety National Law.

Reporting to the National Manager Investigations, and under the supervision of a Principal Investigator, the Senior Investigator will attend and conduct investigations into serious rail incidents, complete investigation plans, witness statements, records of interview, briefs of evidence, and on occasion represent ONRSR at courts and tribunals.

The position works in close relationship with other rail safety officers and external stakeholders from safety and regulatory agencies when attending rail incident scenes. In addition, this position is required to work closely with subject matter experts to identify safety deficiencies and breaches of legislation by individuals and accredited rail transport operators.

About you

We have Senior Investigators working in most capital cities around Australia. You will need to contribute to a national team and liaise with your team members and supervisors regularly, at times remotely. You will be a team player who can demonstrate initiative and adopt a collaborative approach in the work environment.

It is expected that you will be proactive and possess a strong work ethic to operate autonomously under broad direction. We are a small organisation which means you will be exposed to many areas of the business and develop opportunities to further your career.

You will have extensive experience in conducting interviews, preparing statements, affidavits, and the use of legislated powers to identify, collect, secure, and manage evidence and confidential information from regulatory activities and compliance investigations.

This is a unique role, which will allow you to apply your experience in stakeholder engagement and relationship management. You will conduct investigations involving both private and public sector organisations and your communication and interpersonal skills will need to be strong to represent ONRSR when engaging with individuals from a wide range of fields within the rail industry.

Your comprehensive abilities in research and analysis will see you working collaboratively with Legal Counsel and developing high-quality written reports and briefs of evidence to support ONRSR's regulatory function, which may include education, administration, or enforcement.

You will be required to work in railway environments, so you must be able to meet the requirement of a Rail Industry Category 3 health assessment and have the emotional and psychological maturity to cope with the possibility of difficult situations. You will have a willingness to undertake field work

that may be outside of normal working hours with some interstate and remote travel.

To be successful in the role you should be able to demonstrate experience and/or hold formal qualifications in the following fields:

- Conducting and coordinating complex investigations.
- Incident or accident investigation.
- Knowledge of risk and safety management systems.
- Regulatory, enforcement or compliance experience.

	<p>Your Responsibilities</p> <p>As an appointed Senior Investigator, using your demonstrated ability and understanding of ONRSR's policies, procedures and business processes, you will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Undertake assigned regulatory tasks including enquiries and investigations in accordance with the policies, procedures and business processes of ONRSR. • Provide analysis of rail transport operator's compliance with its safety management system as an input to enquiries and investigations. • Ensure that technical issues are identified, and appropriate specialist input obtained for specific aspects of enquiries and investigations.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Prepare enquiry and comprehensive investigation reports including detailed findings and recommended regulatory responses. • Prepare prosecution briefs based on investigation reports to support court actions. • Maintain accurate records ensuring all evidence and records are maintained consistent with ONRSR business process requirements. • Assist in coaching Rail Safety Officers on basic aspects of ONRSR's investigation processes. • Other duties as directed for the purpose of discharging the duties required by the role.
	<p>What you Bring – Key Competencies</p> <p>Key to success in this role is that you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Have an appropriate tertiary qualification in investigations • Relevant work experience in transport or safety within a regulatory, operational or heavy engineering environment. • Demonstrated experience in the conduct of safety investigations and/or regulatory investigations. • Demonstrated experience in the interpretation and administration of legislation. • Extensive understanding of the principles of integrated safety management systems, risk management, and their application to railway operations and the Rail Safety National Law. • Excellent interpersonal and written and verbal communication skills, including the ability to effectively consult, liaise and negotiate with internal and external customers and rail transport operators and to facilitate their cooperation and support to achieve desired outcomes. • Possess self-motivation and flexibility of approach, able to make decisions and adopt work practices to meet changing work requirements and situations. • Demonstrated ability to work as part of a team. • Experience in and knowledge of the rail industry is highly desirable. • Relevant rail industry qualifications are desirable. <p>Helpful qualifications and experience</p> <p>While experience and qualifications in the rail industry is highly desirable if you've had previous experience in a safety investigations, coordinating complex investigations or knowledge of risk and safety management systems will also be viewed favourably.</p> <p>You must hold and maintain a current driver's licence, the right to work in Australia and be comfortable to undertake a criminal history check and meet the requirements of a Category 3 Rail Safety Worker in accordance with the National Standard for Health Assessment of Rail Safety Workers.</p> <p>Your compliance</p> <p>As a regulator, it is important that we are all on the same page when it comes to safety and risk management and everyone at ONRSR is responsible to actively</p>

	<p>supporting this aspect of our role to promote a positive and safe culture. ONRSR has a zero tolerance to the use of alcohol and non-prescription drugs for all workers while undertaking ONRSR work. This includes workers recalled to duty unexpectedly who should decline to work if doing so puts them in breach of the Drug and Alcohol Policy.</p> <p>Other items of note</p> <p>On occasions, this role will require you to work outside of normal business hours, on weekends and public holidays. There is a requirement to travel which may include short stays in ONRSR interstate offices.
