The Role - Your impact and contribution

The **Principal Investigator** takes a lead role in the coordination and planning of the conduct of complex rail safety investigations that may involve multiple duty holders and witnesses and lead complex rail safety investigations into possible breaches of the rail safety law, including as a result of rail occurrences.

The position provides high level advice for assessment of investigation practices and the conduct of those practices and initiates and leads operational projects relating to operational matters or office operations. The position also performs a key role in establishing effective regulatory relationships with senior regulatory investigation agencies and other external stakeholders.

Reporting to the National Manager the role is expected to provide high level leadership, advice management and coordination of a national team of senior investigators seeing you develop investigation strategies and coordinate their delivery to meet our national objectives.

Your Responsibilities

Combining your enthusiasm for contributing to public safety with your seasoned abilities in leading investigations and complex casework, you will:

- Undertake initiated and assigned regulatory tasks including enquiries and investigations in accordance with the policies, procedures, and business processes of ONRSR.
- Assess evidence obtained through investigations for relevance and admissibility to provide authoritative advice on rail safety matters to the investigations team.
- Provide recommendations to the National Manager Investigations including of a strategic nature regarding overall office operations.
- Provide a high level of leadership and coordination to a team of senior investigators.
- Assist the National Manager Investigations with the development of investigation strategies and/or procedures to meet national objectives and coordinate the delivery of these strategies and/or procedures.
- Provide analysis of rail transport operator's compliance with its safety management system as an input to enquiries and investigations.
- Ensure that technical issues are identified, and appropriate specialist input obtained for specific aspects of enquiries and investigations.
- Prepare comprehensive investigation reports including detailed findings and recommended regulatory responses.
- Prepare prosecution briefs based on investigation reports to support court actions.
- Maintain accurate records ensuring all evidence and records are maintained consistent with ONRSR business process requirements.
- Assist in coaching Rail Safety Officers on basic aspects of ONRSR's investigation processes.
- Other duties as directed for the purpose of discharging the functions required by the role.

What you Bring - Key Competencies

Key to success in this role is that you have:



- Minimum qualification of Diploma of Government Investigations or ability to obtain within six months of appointment.
- Senior level investigation experience in investigations within a regulatory, operational or heavy engineering environment.
- High level knowledge/understanding of safety duty-based law to direct the implementation of relevant systems, policies, standards, and procedures.

- Extensive understanding of the principles of integrated safety management systems, risk management, and their application to railway operations and the *Rail Safety National Law*.
- Highly developed interpersonal and written and verbal communication skills, including the ability to effectively consult, liaise and negotiate with internal and external customers and rail transport operators and to facilitate their cooperation and support to achieve desired outcomes.
- Possess self-motivation and flexibility of approach, able to make decisions and adopt work practices to meet changing work requirements and situations.
- Emotional and psychological maturity to cope with the possibility of difficult situations.
- Proven ability to provide leadership and mentoring in a team environment.
- Appropriate tertiary qualifications in a safety, investigation or engineering discipline or equivalent work experience.

Helpful qualifications and experience

Qualifications in the rail industry is highly desirable.

You must hold and maintain a current driver's licence, the right to work in Australia and be comfortable to undertake a criminal history check and meet the requirements of a Category 3 Rail Safety Worker in accordance with the National Standard for Health Assessment of Rail Safety Workers.

Your compliance

As a regulator, it is important that we are all on the same page when it comes to safety and risk management and everyone at ONRSR is responsible to actively supporting this aspect of our role to promote a positive and safe culture. ONRSR has a zero tolerance to the use of alcohol and non-prescription drugs for all workers while undertaking ONRSR work. This includes workers recalled to duty unexpectedly who should decline to work if doing so puts them in breach of the Drug and Alcohol Policy.

Other items of note

On occasions, this role will require you to work outside of normal business hours, on weekends and public holidays. There is a requirement to travel which may include short stays in ONRSR interstate offices. If you would like more information about how ONRSR regulates please read the ONRSR Way 2020.
